Thanksgiving Football 50 Years Ago

The year was 1962, the date was Thanksgiving and the United States was recovering from the high drama of the Cuban Missile Crisis. President Kennedy had just announced that we would begin an effort to send men to the moon and the cost of gasoline at the Medfield Mobil gas station was going for 26 cents a gallon. At Medfield High School, that Thanksgiving Day, the football Warriors were losing a heart-breaking 14-8 game to a strong Holliston High team before a crowd of 1,800. The year 1962 saw the Medfield team grind-out its most successful season in many years, completing a 5-3 record. One of those football victories was over defending Class D Champions, Manchester.

On that Thanksgiving morning 50 years ago, Holliston opened the rain and mud-soaked game with a series of quick passes that moved the ball down to the Warrior 22 yard line. Holliston Quaterback Stuart Maitland then connected with co-captain end James Lomuscio in the end zone for the score. The extra points then gave Holliston a sudden 8-0 lead.

In the second period, sparked by halfback Bruce Allen, fullback Doug Vliet and quarterback Mike Rogers, Medfield drove from their own 36 yard line down to the Holliston 26. Vliet, who would finish the season as second high league scorer, was especially sharp in that drive, picking up hard fought yardage. Holliston, however, was able to stop the Warriors on downs. Just before the half, Holliston again threatened but was stymied when defensive guard Philip Clancy drove the Holliston quarterback into the mud for a loss and turnover. The half ended with the Panthers clinging to a 8-0 lead.

Medfield opened the second half with two first downs before being stopped by the Holliston defense. A long Vliet punt was downed by Warrior left end Bill Callahan on the Panther one yard line. Three plays later, Craig Magnussen recovered a Holliston fumble on the 12-yard line. A handoff to Vliet ran the ball down to the Holliston 4-yard line. Medfield co-captain and quarterback Mike Rogers then dove over the goal line for the Warrior score. Rogers then connected to his cousin, BillCallahan, in the end zone to tie the game at 8-8. The Mud-Bowl game sloshed back and forth, late into the forth quarter, when Holliston scored for the second time. Medfield held on the extra points, making the score 14-8. The Warriors began a drive late in the game but were stopped short by the clock.

The 1962 season was the first step in a rebuilding movement that would get better each year, peaking in 1965. In 1965 the football Warriors became the only undefeated and untied football team in school history.
